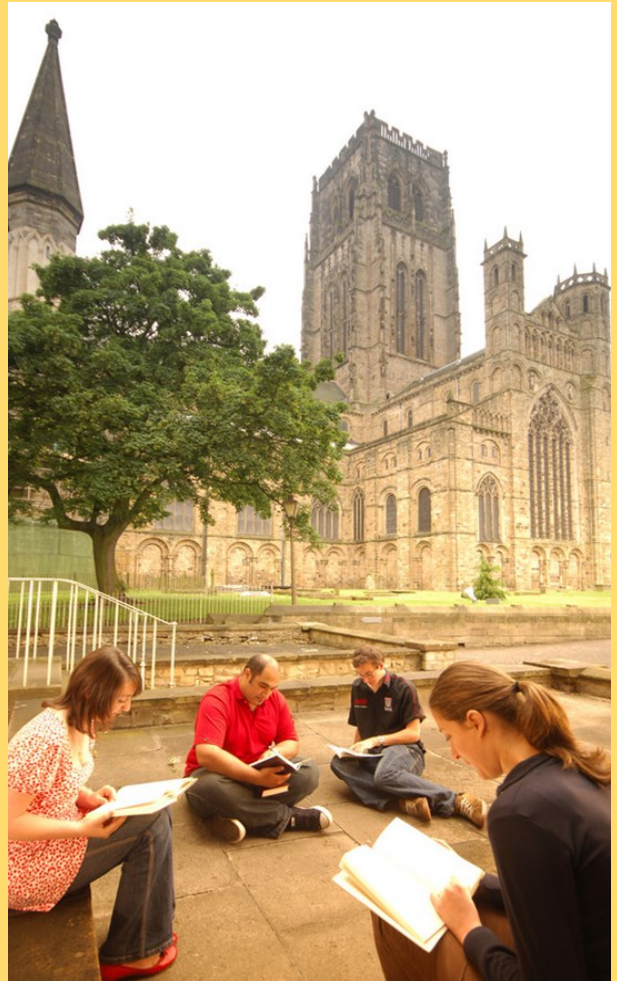
## Call for Papers
