

From the Vatican, 16 June 2015

Your Eminence, Your Grace, Your Excellency:

I have the pleasure of forwarding to you a Note written by the Holy Father as well as the text of the Encyclical Letter *Laudato Sia* 

All the materials you are receiving at this moment remain under strict embargo until 10:00 a.m. (GMT) or 12:00 noon (CEST, that is, Rome time) on Thursday 18 June, and the Holy Father expressly asks you to please respect the embargo scrupulously.
