## Music for Advent

### Introduction

Although we cannot have congregational singing in our churches, we know that many of you are either producing virtual music for your parishes, playing instrumental music or (in a few cases) singing as cantors. As such, the DCMA thought that you might appreciate some suggestions for suitable music for the Sundays of Advent. So we have searched the numerous online sources for you and produced a compilation for you. The list is not meant to be exhaustive nor is it advocating any particular genre of music. However, we have only included items which are easily available during this difficult time.

The compilation is in two parts:

First are items that are available in the common hymn books used in the diocese.

Secondly we have included some items that you may perhaps not be familiar with but may wish to look at, even if you do not use them this year.

Alternative sources have been given where items are currently available. You may find that you have many items from OCP, GIA, Taize or the Iona community already in other published versions and collections.

Many parishes are finding settings of the Propers of the Mass (mainly the antiphons) useful, especially at the present time. You may wish to sing these in the original Latin and this site [Saint René Goupil • Gregorian Chant Propers \(ccwatershed.org\)](http://ccwatershed.org) is a good resource.

However, many composers are now setting these antiphons in English. Two such examples are given here:
