

Approaching Pentecost

Pentecost is sometimes referred to as the "Birthday of the Church". It is the day when the Holy Spirit was poured out on a group of confused and anxious people and gave them what they needed to begin the mission Jesus had placed before them.




We know that those early disciples were not the "best of the bunch"! Their time with Jesus on his mission through Galilee to Jerusalem was marked but misunderstandings—thoughts that being a disciple was a short-cut to greatness and power—and, at the end, fear and desertion. Even after meeting Jesus in his risen life, they were not much better. They were, understandably, afraid of him—but were at the receiving end of a lot of kindness and forgiveness on the part of Jesus. This did not stop them heading back to their fishing nets and day-to-day business. At the Ascension, Jesus commissioned them to go and share the good news he had taught them. They returned to Jerusalem and, at last, spent time together in prayer—preparing themselves for whatever the Coming of the Holy Spirit might mean for them. This time of prayer helped them to be open to the gifts the Spirit would give them. The presence of Mary would have reassured them that they were not going mad but that the Spirit was alive and powerful and capable of doing more with and through them than they could ever have imagined.

Pentecost 2015 marks the beginning of the next phase of Forward Together in Hope, Exploring the Way.

As part of the prayer that Bishop Séamus has asked us to ensure underpins the process, various resources will come out at the same time as the new pack.

One thing that will come out before the pack is a Pentecost Novena. This encourages us to follow the example of the early disciples—to pray with an expectation and hope that the Spirit will be renewed among us and the gifts we need to determine God's will for our diocese and to take it forward will be given. It has a simple structure and takes us from Ascension (Thursday if possible) through to Pentecost. It is based on the Gospel for each day with a thought for reflection and then an action point inspired by a short extract from Pope Francis' writing. We have attached it to this e-

mail—feel free to send it on to anyone else you think might be interested. It will also be available through the diocesan website or can be obtained in advance from the Department.

Other materials will be going out to parish clergy and contact people. More information about these next time but they will be available on the diocesan website from Pentecost.

Spirituality Network Meeting

The Diocesan Spirituality Network met last month and enjoyed a session packed with ideas and good conversation.

Tony Sacco joined the meeting to talk about *Forward Together in Hope* and the session continued with a preview of some of the prayer and spirituality materials that will be going out support the next phase, *Exploring the Way*, which will be launched at Pentecost. These include ideas for parish meetings and personal reflection. One idea that particularly caught people's imagination was a 24-hour Prayer. This is exactly what it says – 24 hours with a different kind of prayer for each of the hours. This idea has already been taken up by St Aidan's parish in Ashington—their 24 Hour prayer will take place 12-13 June. (More details from the parish or the Department).

Deacon John Hawthorne talked about the idea he is working on with Deacon Neil Munro in developing men's spirituality groups. A series of meetings starts this month—details alongside.

Sr Sheila McNamara spoke about a course which offers a form of "school of prayer". At their January meeting, the Diocesan Directors proposed schools of

prayer as something to promote and "Come to the Well and Drink" seemed to fit the bill. It has been run in several parishes and has been very well-received. Sr Sheila, Chris Smith and the team from St Antony's are more than happy to offer this to other places. Alongside this, Sr Sheila and Kathryn are offering a training day on Saturday 4 July for people who might be interested in coming along to learn more about the course and work with it locally. This day is being subsidised by the Department for Spirituality and participants will receive the training and course folder (and lunch!) free. However, there will be an expectation that they will, in return, use their training – in a group in their parish or, possibly, as they gain confidence, in other parishes in their deanery.

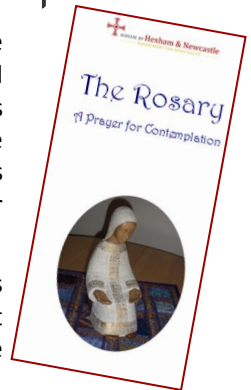
Sr Michael updated the group on Evangelisation matters and Fr Jeroen Hoogland on events coming up at Minsteracres.

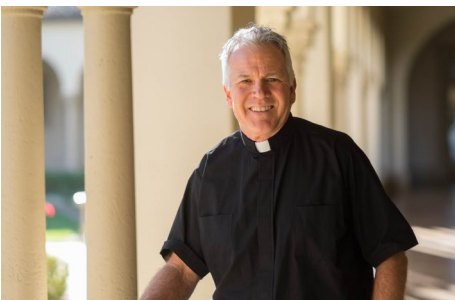
