Lent 2014!

Resources are now ready and will be wending their way to deaneries, parishes, schools and individuals shortly.

This is a very rich Lent with the three great gospels for Year A. Alongside Matthew's accounts of the Temptations of Jesus and his Transfiguration, we have the meetings between Jesus and the Samaritan Woman at the Well—the Man born Blind and the raised-back-to-life Lazarus. These gospels have played an important part in the formation of people preparing for baptism since the late 300s and are still used in Years B and C when there are people to be baptised at Easter.

As well as the gospels, we also have the exhortation from Pope Francis about the Joy of the Gospel so it seemed appropriate to link the two. For this Lent, we have produced a series of leaflets suitable for use by groups in parishes, schools' staffs or older students and individuals.




They include opening responses (mainly for groups but allow individuals to have a short reflection on the Sign of the Cross). After the reference for the Gospel of the Week, there are thoughts to prompt personal reflection followed by a few more to help groups to share their thoughts and insights with each other. This is followed by one or more extracts from the Pope's document, "Evangelii Gaudium", that linked with the Gospel and a few thoughts to deepen that link. The final section is to come up with an action point for the week—making the prayer we have shared real for those around us.

The leaflets are available via email or can be sent out on paper (though this costs much more so please use -or get a friend or relative to use- the electronic method if you can!) They are also available on a CD which also contains PowerPoints to use at meetings where the sheets are used.

The Holy Island sessions have begun to take off with 17 people spending a day with St Paul on the feast of his conversion on 25 January.

The next day will be reflecting on Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation and particularly on how it calls us to a spirituality that brings us closer to God and to our neighbour (particularly those who are poor). The date is **Saturday 22 February** and the times are 11am-3pm. The day itself is free but donations towards tea and coffee and the upkeep of the church are most welcome. You will need to bring a packed lunch.

In March and April, there are days of reflection on the theme: **Living Water-Light-Resurrection**—which is based on the three great Year A gospels. The days are particularly relevant to people preparing to be received into the Church but will also help anyone wishing to deepen their preparations for Easter. The dates and venues for these are:

Thursday 27 March—St Michael's, Houghton-le-Spring, 10.30am-3pm.

Saturday 29 March—Holy Island, 11am-5pm (please note that the causeway is closed between 11.15 and 5.15)

Saturday 5 April—Minsteracres 10.30am-3.30pm (please note £10 donation requested to support work of the Centre)

Saturday 12 April—St Thomas Aquinas, Darlington, 10.30am-3pm.

Great North Passion comes to the North-East

On Good Friday, the BBC will be in Bent's Park, South Shields, televising the Great North Passion.

In the weeks leading up to the events, communities across the North-East will work together to transform shipping containers into a work of art which reflects their area and the Stations of the Cross.

These will be brought together in Bent's Park to form a large cross which will be the focus of the retelling of the Passion. There will be music from a hoped-for 1000-strong massed choir and opportunities for participation in the unfolding drama.

Local churches are exploring ways of using the event to reach a wider, local audience over the Easter weekend – details to follow.

The Great North Passion will be broadcast on Good Friday, 18 April on BBC One.
