Mary: Disciple of Joy!

May is traditionally the month dedicated to Mary—when the beauty of spring in the northern hemisphere seems to reflect the beauty of the Mother of God.

Mary is the perfect disciple and her example of a faith-filled life can inspire our own. It is, therefore, not surprising that Pope Francis draws on her life when he wants to speak of the joy that the Gospel of Christ offers to the world.

Here are some extracts that you might like to reflect on—perhaps with an icon or favourite picture or statue of Mary—or out in the open savouring the loveliness of spring.

The Gospel, radiant with the glory of Christ's cross, constantly invites us to rejoice. A few examples will suffice. "Rejoice!" is the angel's greeting to Mary (Lk 1:28). Mary's visit to Elizabeth makes John leap for joy in his mother's womb (cf. Lk 1:41). In her song of praise, Mary proclaims: "My spirit rejoices in God my Saviour" (Lk 1:47). (paragraph 5)

- Look at the extracts referred to here and think about these and the other Joyful Mysteries...and the place joy has in your own life.

The memory of the faithful, like that of Mary, should overflow with the wondrous things done by God. (142)

- What memories do you have of wondrous things done by God—for you or for others or simply for the world at large?

Mary was able to turn a stable into a home for Jesus, with poor swaddling clothes and an abundance of love. (286)

- What does Mary's example suggest about what you could do with a few "poor" things and an abundance of love?

Mary let herself be guided by the Holy Spirit on a journey of faith towards a destiny of service and fruitfulness. (287)

- What might your own "destiny of service and fruitfulness" look like?

Whenever we look to Mary, we come to believe once again in the revolutionary nature of love and tenderness. In her we see that humility and tenderness are not virtues of the weak but of the strong who need not treat others poorly in order to feel important themselves. (288)

the Centre for Catholic Studies. They will be joined by **TenTen Theatre** who will offer thought-provoking drama and **More than Dance**, **Diocesan Church Music Association** and **YMT** who will inspire the children and young people in their own activities.

Last year, people were welcomed by **St Cuthbert's Primary School Hartlepool Steel band** and disappointed when they had to head home. This year, they will be with us for the whole of Saturday. In the evening there will be the chance to let your hair down (or simply enjoy the spectacle) with the welcome return of the **Whole Shebang Ceilidh band**.

Open Doors, Open Hands: Church with a Mission

In the Easter break, Kathryn had the great joy of welcoming a young Missionary of Africa, Fr Anselme Tarpaga, for a few days. He hails from Burkina Faso and is concluding studies in Rome before heading to take up a post at the Basilica of Our Lady of Africa in Algiers.

Fr Anselme fell in love with the north-east and Holy Island in particular and was interested in hearing of the approaches taken by Aidan and Cuthbert as well as Benet Biscop and Wilfrid and how they reflect the work of contemporary missionaries.

Most of us are not called to a ministry that takes us far from home but it is worth noting that in his Exhortation, *Evangelii Gaudium*, Pope Francis takes Blessed John Henry Newman's phrase, "I have my mission" a step further and says, "I am a mission" - and he does not mean

just himself! Each of us is called to share the joy and comfort that our Faith brings us with others. And to sustain it, Pope Francis says, the Church needs the deep breath of prayer—to get life-giving spiritual oxygen flowing through its veins! It also needs practical action and on 24 May, the Evangelisation Team will be holding a day preparing for Welcome Back Sunday (Pentecost). The session is at St Aloysius, Hebburn and runs from 10-1.00pm. Invitation Cards can be picked up for parishes to be distributed to those who have drifted away from church.

There will be a **Follow up and Support Day** in St Joseph's Gateshead on 28 June (10.00am—1.00pm) where the team will share more ideas. Sr Michael says, "This is exactly what Pope Francis is asking for - a missionary church not a church that exists for itself and is intuned." 

Prayer Shawl Ministry

Over Easter, Kathryn visited a friend recuperating from cancer who showed her a blanket created for her by a group from a local church. This was not the church she attends—nor did she know the people—but the love and warmth of the blanket was a real comfort during a very difficult time.
