
Celebrating the Mercy of God

he summer has been filled with stories of horrible things happening to good and decent people who happened to be in the wrong places at the wrong times. For those who see religion as a problem it has been something of a field day. But, as we know, true faith in God is about truth, justice and peace. It does not mean that there are no differences—or that there will not be hard questions - or even points where people simply cannot agree.

But fundamentally, our faith—and that of all who can trace their faith heritage back to Abraham and Sarah—declares that we are children of the One God.

A year ago, the Department for Spirituality teamed up with the Departments for Interreligious Relations and Justice and Peace to look at how we might mark the Year of Mercy together. You will have read accounts of one idea we came up with—the Voices of Mercy looking at the works of mercy and how people put them into practice.

On Wednesday 21
September we are holding a much bigger event—at least we hope it is going to be bigger! It is called 'Celebrating the Mercy of God' and will involve three people from the three Abrahamic faith (Jewish, Muslim and Christian) talking about their tradition's understanding of the God of Mercy we all



believe in. They will also offer a short prayer.

We will be joined by Bishop Séamus, Anglican Bishop Frank White, other faith and civic leaders and guests from other faiths. It is important that, as the hosting community, we are there in decent numbers too so, if you are free and able to come, we would be delighted to see you!

The talks start at 7.00pm and finish at 8.30pm but, in keeping with the tradition of the Community, we are invited for a meal beforehand that will start at 6.15pm.


