Information about the Bishops Chalice

During the ordination Mass, Bishop Robert will be using what is known as the 'ha-penny' Chalice or the 'Watts' Chalice from Ushaw College. This chalice, which was traditionally used at all priestly ordinations for the Diocese of Hexham and Newcastle, has a beautiful story behind it. At a very young age, a 5-year-old boy who decided he wanted to be a priest started to save for his own chalice. He did this by collecting these ha-penny coins. Tragically he died before he was old enough to enter Ushaw and so his parents bought a chalice in his memory and donated it to the college. All the coins which the boy had saved up were fixed onto the underbelly of the base of the Chalice. As we celebrate this ordination Mass we remember and give thanks for the gift of the Sacred Priesthood while also praying for the repose of the soul of this young boy.



Bishop:	Are you resolved to consecrate your life to God for the salvation of his people, and to unite yourself more closely every day to Christ the High Priest, who offered himself for us to the Father as a perfect sacrifice?

As the central and most solemn part of the ordination rite approaches, we recognise our total dependence on God and join in prayer with the whole Church in glory in Heaven. Bishop Robert invites the people to join him in prayer for Deacon Jonathon.


Bishop: My dear people, let us pray that the all-powerful Father may pour out the gifts of heaven on this servant of his, whom he has chosen to be a priest.

The Laying on of Hands

Deacon Jonathon goes to Bishop Robert and kneels before him. Bishop Robert than lays his hands on his head in silence. The Laying on of hands – rooted in Scripture and the Tradition of the Church – signifies the conferral of the Holy Spirit.

The Prayer of Consecration

With Deacon Jonathon kneeling before him, the Bishop extends his hands and prays the Prayer of Consecration, asking God to consecrate Deacon Jonathon for the Order of Priesthood. This prayer completes the essential act of ordination and confers the Sacrament of Holy Orders upon Deacon Jonathon.

Bishop:

Come to our help, Lord, Holy Father, almighty and eternal God; you are the source of every honour and dignity, of all progress and stability. You watch over the growing family of man by your gift of wisdom and your pattern of order. When you had appointed high priests to rule your people, you chose other men next to them in rank and dignity to be with them and to help them in their task; and so there grew up the ranks of priests and the offices of Levites, established by sacred rites. In the desert you extended the spirit of Moses to seventy wise men who helped him to rule the great company of his people. You shared among the sons of Aaron the fullness of their father's power, to provide worthy priests in sufficient number for the increasing rites of sacrifice and worship. With the same loving care, you gave companions to your Son's apostles to help them in teaching the faith: they preached the Gospel to the whole world. Lord, grant also to us such fellow workers for we are weak, and our need is greater. Almighty Father grant to this servant of yours the dignity of the priesthood. Renew within him the Spirit of holiness. As a co-worker with the order of bishops may he be faithful to the ministry that he receives from you, Lord God, and be to others a model of right conduct. May he be faithful in working with the order of bishops, so that the words of the Gospel may reach the ends of the earth, and the family of nations, made one in Christ, may become God's one, holy people. 
Kiss of Peace





If for any reason, you are unable to receive Holy Communion, either because you are not a Catholic or you know of some other reason, you are very welcome to come forward and receive a blessing. If you wish to receive a blessing, please come forward and indicate this intention by crossing your arms over your chest so the priest is aware.


